Treasurer Report

In the 2017 financial year, the club posted a small loss of \$1,829. This result is due in part to the following: slower fee recovery, washout of our Gala Day, and some reduction in playing numbers, particularly at the small sided level. Our fee structure is based on keeping costs reasonable for our members. It is worth noting that for the total cost of a players registration, the club gets around \$5 to go towards playing strips (in the absence of a sponsor), equipment, grounds maintenance, general running of the club and provision for future growth and development plans. This is why we rely so heavily on volunteers, and are so thankful to our club and team sponsors and those people who assist with fundraising throughout the season and beyond. Our long term plans remain the same as last year and are still progressing. These outcomes include:

- Upgraded fencing to improve safety and prevent vehicle access to fields;
- Major earthworks and tree removal to offer additional fields for junior football;
- Upgrade of canteen facility

Once again, I will take the opportunity to highlight challenges and opportunities that financially impact our club:

1. Fee Recovery

2017 again sees our club in the position of chasing fees at the end of the season. This takes valuable time away from focusing on club improvements and is unfair to those parents and players who do the right thing. Our aim is to get kids on the field and kicking the ball wherever possible, and our club hates preventing players from taking the fields. Our club wishes to remind all parents and players that we have to pay North Coast Football for registration the instant a player takes the field. A big thankyou to all parents and players who have paid their fees, it puts our club in a stronger position to deliver better facilities, better equipment and a better experience to our players, parents, supporters and volunteers.

2. Canteen

The club would not have the capacity to generate revenue from the provision of a canteen facility if it wasn't for the hard work of the parent and club volunteers who operate the canteen week-in, week out. The club wants to thank those parents who donated their time to assist in the canteen in 2017. We understand that it sometimes feels like a hassle, and you may miss a half of one or two of your child's games in a season, but the club would not be able to provide the facilities and equipment to our players without this vital volunteer support. A huge thank you also needs to go out to those special volunteers who go above and beyond and spend many hours working the canteen over the course of the year. A particularly HUGE thank you must also go to our fabulous canteen manager, Liz, who spent most of her waking hours setting up, provisioning, working in and cleaning up the canteen and change/toilet facilities this year. This canteen

manager position is becoming vacant at the AGM and we will need assistance. The provision of canteen facilities at our venue will be at risk if nobody comes forward to help with this role.

3. Sponsorship and fundraising

This year saw the sharing of the crown raffles (previously undertaken over the full year by senior men's teams) amongst all teams within the club. We thank those parents who assisted managers by putting their hand up to help, as this is now our biggest single source of fundraising revenue which assists in delivering a great football experience to YOUR kids. The major raffle was also a success and we want to thank all the prize donators for their selflessness and support and extend that thanks to those people who purchased tickets. The event would not have come together without the management of Sharon Powell as this was a huge undertaking. If a similar raffle is to be run in future, it will require a few more hands to pitch in. We would like to thank our sponsors who contribute so much to our club. Without your support we would struggle to provide our players with the strips that they love wearing on the weekends. We would also not be able to equip our teams and provide the facilities to the standard we currently have. Your ongoing support is appreciated and we are proud to display your business names on our website, across our uniforms and on our fantastic new signs. Our committee is always looking for options to boost fund raising, but it requires the input and support from the club community. Unfortunately, with rising costs and reduced sponsorship dollars, the only way to ensure the continued viability of the club is to increase fees, which we have resisted for several seasons. Should any member know of any fundraising/sponsorship ideas, please contact the committee.

Looking to the future

Moving into 2018, our club is in a strong position to continue to develop our players and our facilities, but this will only materialise with the support of its members and the participation of more people at the committee level. Our special projects team is advancing discussions with relevant stakeholders to consolidate and upgrade club facilities to deliver a better footballing experience for our club community. The committee wants to thank all players, parents, volunteers and sponsors who have worked really hard this year to make Westlawn Tigers the fantastic club that it is.
